It has given me an invaluable network of new like minded agents of change and has stretched me to do more than I thought was possible. I am grateful to say that as a result of INT and my group project, my colleagues and I were able to provide a 6-week training workshop for 25 parents in Uganda. Providing them with insightful information, practical tools and strategies on how they can help their children succeed in all they do. This has not only then changed and transformed the homes of our participants and colleagues but it will provide a better opportunity for success to all of the Next Generation Leaders for Uganda who are growing up in those homes. What an opportunity!

As you can tell by now, I believe INT is an amazing course and a must for anyone who wants to be an agent of transformation in their community, nation, continent or the world. I must admit I had no idea what I was in for when I started but INT has shown me that I can do more physically, mentally, intellectually, spiritually and technologically than I thought I could. I have been encouraged and challenged to move from one level to another in terms of my ministry and calling. I am greatly encouraged, excited and ready for the mission that God has set before me. This time has taught me that I can push myself to greater limits with

• GOD HAS GIVEN ME EVERY-THING I NEED FOR LIFE AND GOD-LINESS. This includes the resources, energy, knowledge, wisdom and understanding needed to carry out the calling and purpose he has placed before us. We should not shrink back out of fear when we see and grasp the bigness of what God has called us to. He would only give it to us if he knew we could handle it.

• NOTHING IS IMPOSSIBLE WITH GOD, I can do all things with Him and through Him. If someone was to tell me

that I would spend four days not sleeping I might have defaulted to my comfort zone and said, "I can't do that..." With such a preconditioned idea I would have missed out on the fullness God had for me.

• BE A LIFELONG LEARNER and seek to be an expert in my area of passion and calling. Doing that will strengthen me in my calling and add a level of credibility to all I do.

• BE INTENTIONAL TO LISTEN AND HEAR FROM GOD; the major sign that I am on the right path is that I will always feel a sense of peace about a decision. If I do not yet have peace about it, I should not do it. If someone or something is constantly disrupting my peace, it is okay to know that I need to step away from that person or situation for the time being so that I can regroup and hear from God regarding that matter.



I would recommend INT to anyone who wants to be challenged and stretched into the next realm or into a new level of ministry. HMT, especially in conjunction with INT, is a perfect opportunity for people to evaluate their current life course and to hear God's mind about the next steps they should take in their journey of life, transformation and ministry. I believe INT marks a turning point in my life where I am jumping in full force into my next level of ministry and global impact. Before this point I had not yet started fully. I believe now, after 12 years of being a missionary in Uganda, I have been commissioned to start fully! Thank you INT, I do not take this opportunity for granted.
