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## **What would you like your students to know about you?**

I was part of the Class 17 of INT.

When I came for the INT Oakseed Course, I was very depressed because I could see the pathetic state of affairs in our country, and felt helpless to do anything about it. The Oakseed programme enabled me to understand the root

of the problem, identify my place/space in the solution and equipped with the no-excuse leadership attitude needed to participate in the cause of National Transformation. It helped me clarify my Sphere of Influence, Education.

My Individual Project is offering holistic education to youths through Transform Educational Centre, a Christian Secondary School located in Kasangati.

INT enabled me to scale this up to a National Transformation level.

It has since impacted hundreds of youths. HMT strengthened this No-excuse attitude, and also -gave me the space to develop a Personal path to align myself to the rigour and courage



required of a National Transformer. As a result, I have been able to: - Implement my project effectively - Teach our Church members Transformational principles through a Course designed with heavy input of what I learnt from INT - Write a number of books out of what I have learnt from INT including Rebuilding Walls (Lessons from Nehemiah) The Transformational Leader Portrait of a Great Teacher A Different Spirit - Work Redefined

**What inspires you to offer your expertise to the students at INT?**

The INT Course was transformational to me. Of the courses I have done, it has had the biggest impact on me. I took it, not just as another course, but as a path to furthering my life call. As a teacher by calling, I am inspired to support as many people as possible to live their calling in life.
